- VII. **New Business:**
 - A. **Financial Report:** Sec./Treas. Mr. Singer read Financial Report into the record.
Motion: Ben Blackhorse **Second:** Sally Chee
 - Sally Chee- asked about Fund 51 Peabody fund, asked if the funds are going to be used for our chapter membership who live and reside on Black Mesa.
 - Martha Young- commented about the history of the PWCC, and the funding that have been given to the Navajo Nation. Asked about the funds that were given to the Nation, other surrounding chapters and Kayenta Chapter. Asked about the oversight and how funds were given out.
 - Shandiin Parrish- great question, Kayenta chapter almost got a million dollars, about \$750,000. When Kayenta mine closed and the bond lease talks were about to begin, Peabody created a

- chapter community benefit plan, each chapter got \$750,000. Navajo Nation entities and Peabody began talks about the CBP and how funds would be disbursed. Myself and fellow delegates from chapters surrounding Mine Lease argued that our surrounding Chapters deserve separate funds to help those chapters for hosting or being around the Peabody mine and how those communities were affected. So, from those talks and discussions, Peabody allocated those funds for the chapters.
- **Sally Chee**- community members have already laid out priorities on what their needs are and how those funds should be used. Our Black Mesa residents need assistance, we need to help these people that live in that region that don't have water, electricity or septic systems. The late grandma Russell never got to experience electricity and now she is gone, many of our elders are beginning to leave us or have already passed. Our communities around PWCC Kayenta & Black Mesa Mines and Kayenta chapter have been hit hard from these mines, now we need to help the black mesa residents and our Chapters who have been hit hard economically.
- **Dalton Singer**- commented that our Chapter membership has agreed that the funds in fund 51 will be held and used for our Black Mesa residents who are Kayenta Chapter members and their families. We requested from our Black Mesa members a couple times when they came down during a public meeting/hearing and also through BMU that we need a fund management plan from our chapter membership. How they would like to budget the funds, and how they would like to use it and Kayenta Chapter administration will assist them on creating and passing a fund management plan.
- **Albert Bailey**- commented that the other chapters who received these funds have already budgeted those funds for their chapter projects, I believe none were really fully allocated for the Black Mesa residents and one Chapter has invested those funds and to date, they have incurred interest of about \$50,000 or so. Here, our Chapter has agreed that these funds will go to the Kayenta Chapter residents of Black Mesa.
- **Martha Young**- commented about the issues of Black Mesa, going into the history of Peabody company and the business and political side. At this point Vice President Stanley Clitso called a point of order.
- **Stanley Clitso**- called a point of order, reminded Marthal Young and chapter membership that this is the financial report, requested questions directly about the report is needed. Questions about the history and political side of PWCC should not be entertained during the financial report. Those questions need to be brought up at a planning meeting, so we can bring in entities to address those questions. Asked President Bailey to go back to entertaining the Financial Report.
- **Albert Bailey**- ended discussion and urged chapter membership to keep questions to the point of what is being entertained, other wise the meeting/discussions go off subject and we begin to lose chapter membership interest and then begin losing quorum. At this point President Bailey asked if there are any other questions regarding the financial report, if not we ask for the community to vote and accepted the financial report.

- **Sally Chee-** commented the reason she is asking is that our past equipment have been vandalized and are just sitting in the yard and to this date almost all of them are run down and dilapidated. So, if we are purchasing a new equipment, lets make sure it will be stored and maintained properly.
- **Albert Bailey-** stated that all these have to be addressed when purchasing new equipment, the policies and plan of operation have been updated and are stricter, due to the fact that in the past equipment were not take care of or maintained.

- **Sally Chee:** During the design and construction of the Senior Center, we want to ensure qualified and reputable contractors are selected. We do not want to see the same problems experienced with past buildings, such as things breaking down or falling apart.

- **Stanley Clitso:** The Navajo Nation process addresses these concerns and helps ensure the construction is completed properly. During onsite visits, these issues are reviewed, and any additional concerns are identified and addressed by all entities involved in the project.
- **Dalton Singer:** Informed Sally Chee and the Chapter membership that this resolution is intended to begin the drawdown process for the Senior Center funds. While the drawdown is underway, the Chapter will work on developing an RFP for the design, planning, and construction of the Senior Center. During this process, the Chapter will address the questions and concerns raised by the membership. Once the RFP process is completed, the Chapter membership will review and approve the bid selection. All concerns regarding the design, construction, and contractor selection will be addressed transparently throughout the process.

VIII. Reports: (Please limit Reports to 5 minutes and please provide a written report.)

A. Delegate Shaandiin Parrish, 25th Navajo Nation Council

- **Delegate Parrish** thanked the community for passing the resolution to secure the full \$7.2 million for construction of a new Senior Center for the Kayenta Chapter, rather than the original \$6 million without the \$1.2 million contingency funds. She stated that, with the passage of this resolution and the prior Senior Center drawdown resolution, Kayenta Chapter has helped establish a process that has assisted eight other chapters with drawing down their funds. She also discussed funding allocated for N591 to assist with road improvements, including funding benefiting Chilchinbeto. Delegate Parrish stated that she tabled legislation seeking to extend the deadline for Sihasin funds for chapters with ICIP projects. She explained that Kayenta Chapter expended its allocated funds and that it would not be fair to provide extensions to chapters that have not used their funds while other chapters have already completed their projects. Chapters that have used up their funds will now have an opportunity to request additional funding for new projects. Delegate Parrish also addressed concerns regarding the removal of funding for the Kayenta District Prosecutor's Office. She stated that she worked to have the funding restored. Additional concerns were discussed regarding BMU. Kayenta Chapter has a resolution appointing a representative to BMU and has requested that BMU provide monthly reports regarding its activities, issues, and concerns affecting Kayenta Chapter's portion of BMU.
- **Ben Blackhorse** asked about the status of the Navajo Nation's ARPA funds and whether the Nation is in good standing regarding the expenditure of those funds.
- **Delegate Parrish** stated that the Navajo Nation is not currently in good standing and may be required to repay approximately \$24 million due to concerns regarding how the ZenniHome housing contract was handled. She stated that the Navajo Nation Council is currently focusing on the Navajo Nation audit, which includes the ARPA funds and the \$24 million associated with the housing project under the Executive Branch.
- **Ben Blackhorse** raised concerns regarding services and funding for Navajo Nation veterans. He stated that veterans are not receiving adequate assistance, that some funds remain unused, and

that veterans are having difficulty accessing available resources. He also expressed concerns regarding communication between the Navajo Nation Veterans Department and veterans' organizations and agency organizations.

- Delegate Parrish stated that she, along with fellow Council delegates, assisted in making veteran funding available to agencies for local veteran assistance. She stated that efforts are being made to make veteran funding more accessible at the local level while also addressing concerns regarding the Veterans Department under the Executive Branch.
 - Community Member asked about the proposed hydro pump storage project and whether the project would be approved through the Navajo Nation Council in Window Rock.
 - Delegate Parrish explained that the project must go through an established process and that the Department of Justice is still reviewing the proposed projects. She stated that the only activity approved at this time is soil and land testing/surveying. The overall project has not yet been approved at the Chapter, Agency, or Window Rock level. She stated that she will continue to keep the Chapter informed of any new developments.
 - Stanley Clitso expressed appreciation to Delegate Parrish for her assistance with projects that have been completed or proposed for Kayenta Chapter. He stated that she has actively advocated for Kayenta Chapter at the Agency and Window Rock levels and has made Chapter projects and securing funding for those projects a priority. He stated that her continued presence and advocacy at meetings have helped Kayenta Chapter move its projects forward.
 - Dalton Singer encouraged community members to attend Navajo Nation committee meetings, public hearings, and other public meetings. He stated that community participation and directly voicing concerns at these meetings can greatly benefit the Chapter. He shared that he has attended multiple public hearings and continues to advocate for issues affecting Kayenta Chapter, including concerns involving elders, local divisions and departments, and veterans. He encouraged community members to attend public hearings whenever possible and stated that the Chapter will continue to post meeting dates and information regarding local public hearings.

- B. Supervisor Fern Benally, Navajo County Supervisor District 1- provided report, written report added to the meeting minutes.

Good evening. Ya'at'eeh to everyone here. Thank you, Kayenta Chapter Leadership.

1. Navajo County has rescinded all fire restrictions, as did Apache and Coconino Counties. Please continue to be mindful and care for all fires.
2. Weather: All of Arizona will continue to be in the Summer Monsoon Season until the end of September. We're in the Super "El Nino" weather pattern. This predicts the weather will extend from one extreme to another, when it's hot, it will be hot and when the rain comes it may flood areas especially during this monsoon.
 - a. Please be prepared, have water and snacks with you when you travel. Also, have an emergency kit that includes a flashlight with good batteries and a shovel, among other safety items. As well as a well charged cell phone.
 - b. Do not cross running water in the washes out here. 10 inches of waterflow can pull a vehicle with it and 6 inches can knock a person over. Just practice safety all around.
 - c. Navajo County has delivered at least 300-500 sandbags to chapter houses. Chapters can request more sandbags as needed.
3. All Navajo County funds are renewed on July 1, 2026, HURF (highway user revenue fund) and District Funds:
 - a. Chapters can apply for district funds now for office supplies and events; And chapters can submit proposals for small road projects.
 - b. Clinics, Schools and organizations usually also apply. Please send an email to me. I usually let the County Clerk know which I will fund and amount.
 - c. Documents will be send, please fill them out for funding to proceed.
 - d. The annual senior center allocation will likely be processed this September, and I will deliver the checks to each chapter who receives them.
4. Navajo County had offered to purchase supplies for Parrish Crossing, however, because of the delay of IGA and Kayenta Chapter's decision to apply through NACOG. The County's task changed to writing a support letter for the NACOG Grant. NACOG will have a meeting on August 27 to release the information of funding.
5. On US Hwy 163, upon meeting with ADOT, it was decided that the Kayenta chapter will seek funds for road project on US Hwy 163 beginning at US Hwy 160 to Monument Valley High School/Kayenta Boarding School. It needs to cover new crosswalk/pedestrian markings and signs
6. Encourage your teenager and everyone over 18 years of age to register to vote.
 - a. Voter's registration information is available in the chapter administration offices, at Township Office, Post Offices, Navajo County Office at entrance to Kayenta Rural Alternative Hospital, on-line, and the County Recorder's office.
 - b. Voter's Registration is now open until October 5, 2026, for Navajo County/ Arizona State & Federal elections.
