WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. The Healthy Dine Nation Act was initially approved by the Navajo Nation Council in 2014 and reauthorized in 2020 by Resolution No. CD-96-20; and
4. The purpose of this fund is to provide chapters with seed money for leverage to initiate, match, and/or improve community wellness projects; and
5. The Kayenta Chapter has established a proposed budget that complies with the budget guidelines; and
6. The Kayenta Chapter's Unhealthy Food and Beverage Sales Tax for FY2026 will be used for the Kayenta Chapter community members to improve the physical and social environment and prevent the incidence of obesity, diabetes, and other health conditions.

REAFFIRMING RESOLUTION NO. KY26-10-002, APPROVING THE KAYENTA CHAPTER'S SIHASIN FUNDS FOR \$64,051.00 AND TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,000.00 TO BE USED TOWARDS THE MAXIMUM FEASIBLE COST FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE NEW 3500 HEAVY DUTY FLATBED TRUCK.

WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. Pursuant to Kayenta Chapter Resolution No KY26-10-002, approving the Kayenta Chapter's Sihasin Carryover funds for \$64,051.00 and to include additional funds in the amount of \$10,000.00 to be used towards the maximum feasible cost for the purchase of one new 3500 Heavy DUY flatbed truck; and
4. Pursuant to Legislation No 0003-26, an action relating to the Resources and Development Committee and the Naabik'iyati' Committee; Amending Council Resolution CJA-01-21, and resolution NABIAP-24-24; extending the deadline for the expenditure of Sihasin Funds for Chapter Heavy Equipment Purchases; and
5. The new deadline for the Kayenta Chapter to purchase heavy equipment is December 31, 2026; and
6. The Kayenta Chapter has been working diligently with the Navajo Nation Division of Community Development- Capital Project Management Department (CPMD) to bid out on a heavy-duty flat-bed truck; and
7. The \$64,051.00 Sihasin funds allocated for the Kayenta Chapter is not sufficient to purchase a heavy-duty flatbed truck; and
8. The Kayenta Chapter has allocated funds in Fund 03- Land Claims Trust Fund totaling \$10,000.00 to be included toward the maximum feasible cost.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with oversight authority over community development matters, the Navajo Nation Division of Community Development, and the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, among other responsibilities. 2 N.N.C. §500(B); 2 N.N.C. §500(C)(1).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to hear proposed resolutions requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. §700(A); 2 N.N.C. §701(A)(3).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council allocated money from the Síhasin Fund to the Division of Community Development for heavy equipment purchases for Navajo Nation Chapters. Resolution CJA-01-21.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council delegated to the Resources and Development Committee and

1 the Naabik'iyáti' Committee the authority over the deadline for the expenditure of the
2 allocated Síhasin funds. CJA-01-21, Section 4, Paragraph 5.

3
4 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

5 A. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee, through Resolution NABIAP-24-24, attached as **Exhibit A**,
6 approved an extension to projects previously approved in Resolution NABIAP-24-24.

7 B. Resolution CJA-01-21, included in **Exhibit A**, allocated Síhasin Funds for the Division of
8 Community Development to purchase certain heavy equipment for Navajo Nation Chapters.

9 C. Resolution CJA-01-21 initially established a deadline of 90 days from the date of distribution
10 of funds for heavy equipment purchases to revert back to the Síhasin Fund. The original
11 deadline has been previously extended, most recently by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee in
12 Resolution NABIAP-24-24, which extended the deadline to December 31, 2025.

13 D. Whippoorwill Chapter approved chapter resolution, WC-25-21, requesting its project
14 approved in Resolution CJA-01-21 be amended. The chapter resolution, attached as **Exhibit**
15 **B**, indicates that it would like to change the approved project from purchasing a forklift to
16 truck. The chapter also indicates that the COVID-19 pandemic and Navajo Nation
17 government shutdown contributed to the delay in allowing the chapter to expend the funds
18 timely.

19 E. Before Whippoorwill Chapter's project can be amended in Resolution CJA-01-21, the
20 deadline must be extended.

21
22 **SECTION THREE. APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF THE SÍHASIN FUNDS**
23 **EXPENDITURE DEADLINE FOR CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT PURCHASES**

24 A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an extension of the deadline of Síhasin Fund, initially
25 approved in Resolution CJA-01-21, and most recently extended in Resolution NABIAP-24-
26 24, for Navajo Nation Chapters heavy equipment purchases until **December 31, 2026**.

27 B. Any Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 that are not spent or encumbered in accordance
28 with the approved Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan by the new December 31,
29 2026, deadline shall revert to the Síhasin Fund, unless otherwise recommended by the
30 Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee.

1 C. If the funding has already reverted to the Síhasin Fund, the Office of Management and
2 Budget is directed to promptly transfer those funds to the appropriate DCD Business Unit
3 for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan approved in CJA-01-21.

5 **SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE**

6 This Action shall become effective in accordance with 12 N.N.C. §2505 and 2 N.N.C. §189.

8 **SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE**

9 If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or

AN ACTION RELATING TO THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE AND THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING CJA-01-21 AND NABIJN-18-22 TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF SÍHASIN FUNDS FOR CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT PURCHASES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with oversight authority over community development matters, the Navajo Nation Division of Community Development, and the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, among other responsibilities. 2 N.N.C. § 500(B); 2 N.N.C. § 500(C) (1).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to hear proposed resolutions requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) (9); 2 N.N.C. § 700(A); 2 N.N.C. § 701(A) (3).
- C. In Resolution No. CJA-01-21 the Navajo Nation Council allocated money from the Síhasin Fund to the Division of Community Development ("DCD") for heavy equipment purchases for the 110 Chapters.
- D. Also in CJA-01-21, the Council delegated to the Resources and Development Committee and the Naabik'iyáti' Committee the authority over the deadline for the expenditure of the allocated Síhasin funds. The relevant pages of Resolution No. CJA-01-21 are attached hereto as EXHIBIT 1.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. As stated above, CJA-01-21 allocated money from the Síhasin Fund for the DCD to purchase certain heavy equipment for the 110 Chapters. Although CJA-01-21 was line-item vetoed by former President Jonathan Nez, the veto did not affect the allocated funds for the Chapter heavy equipment purchases.
- B. CJA-01-21 established a deadline for the use of the approved Síhasin funds for the heavy equipment purchases. The original deadline has been extended several times, most recently by the

Naabik'iyáti' Committee in Resolution No. NABIJN-18-22. The extant deadline for the heavy equipment purchases was December 31, 2023. A copy of NABIJN-18-22 is attached hereto as EXHIBIT 2.

- C. At this time, the DCD states that it needs more time to complete all purchases of heavy equipment for the 110 Chapters, and to fully expend the Síhasin funds that were allocated in CJA-01-21. EXHIBIT 3. According to DCD, the remaining equipment consists of 84 items, and the remaining amount of Síhasin funds to be expended is \$3,777,954.96. EXHIBIT 4.
- D. The DCD has provided the original list of heavy equipment approved for purchase for the Chapters. EXHIBIT 5. The DCD has also provided a list of the heavy equipment for which purchases have been completed. EXHIBIT 6.
- E. Because of the Chapters' need for the heavy equipment, the Navajo Nation finds it to be in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People to extend the deadline established in NABIJN-18-22 for the DCD's expenditure of the Síhasin funds approved in Resolution No. CJA-01-21.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF THE SÍHASIN FUNDS EXPENDITURE DEADLINE FOR CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT PURCHASES

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an extension of the deadline for the expenditure of the Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 for the 110 Chapters' heavy equipment purchases from December 31, 2023, as established in NABIJN-18-22, to December 31, 2025.
- B. Any Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 that are not spent or encumbered in accordance with the approved Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan by the new December 31, 2025 deadline shall revert to the Síhasin Fund, unless otherwise recommended by the Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee.
- C. If the \$3,777,954.96 has already reverted to the Síhasin Fund, the Office of Management and Budget is hereby directed to promptly transfer the \$3,777,954.96 to the appropriate DCD business unit for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan approved in CJA-01-21.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective in accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 2505 and 2 N.N.C. § 189.

SECTION FIVE. SUPERSEDING AND SAVING CLAUSES

- A. With respect to the deadline for the expenditure of Sihasin funds for the Chapter heavy equipment purchases approved in CJA-01-21, the new deadline set forth in Section Three (A) of this Action shall supersede inconsistent provisions in any previous resolutions.
- B. If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a final order of a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review all proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (9).
- C. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 301 (B) (2).
- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to provide oversight over water and chapter activities, as well as oversight over community and economic development on the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 501 (C) (1).
- E. The Navajo Nation Code provides that the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund ("Síhasin Fund") is as follows:

§ 2502 Purpose

- T. Per CAP-35-18, Section Four (C), each Council District was awarded Síhasin Funding of \$4,166,666.67; the President's line-item veto of the Former BIA Compound Project resulted in the Shiprock Council District receiving less than \$4,166,666.67 and less funding than all other Council Districts.
- U. As set forth in Shiprock Chapter Resolution No. 10-13-19-006-SHIP (amending 09-17-19-073-SHIP), attached as **Exhibit D**, the Shiprock Chapter requests that the Navajo Nation Council approve the following projects totaling \$350,000 to replace the line-item vetoed "Former BIA Compound" project: Veteran Cemetery for \$110,000; Veterans Waterline for \$15,000; Shiprock Baseball Field for \$75,000.00; and a Portable Building for Elected Officials for \$150,000, as set forth in the Shiprock Chapter Project Recapture Expenditure Plan attached as **Exhibit E**.
- V. The Navajo Nation also finds that using the Síhasin Fund to fund the Shiprock Chapter projects, as set forth in **Exhibit E**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of the Navajo People and Navajo communities.
- W. The Wide Ruins South Phase II Waterline Extension project, as set forth in **Exhibit F**, has been on the Indian Health Service Sanitation Deficiency System (SDS) for more than five years, but has yet to be funded despite the fact that the project will provide water to at least 46 families in desperate need of water to comply with Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidance to prevent infection of COVID-19 and mitigate its spread throughout the community.
- X. The Navajo Nation also finds that using the Síhasin Fund to fund the Wide Ruins South Phase II Waterline Extension project, as set forth in **Exhibit F**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of the Navajo People and Navajo communities.

SECTION THREE. ALLOCATION OF \$23,954,719.77 TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ADOPTION OF THE CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates twenty-three million nine hundred fifty-four thousand seven hundred nineteen dollars and seventy-seven cents (\$23,954,719.77) from the Síhasin Fund to the Division of Community Development to implement the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit A**.

- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as set forth in this resolution and in Exhibit A.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as follows:

1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$23,954,719.77 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both;
2. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be distributed to the Division of Community Development within ten (10) days following enactment of this legislation;
3. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to purchase the equipment described in Exhibit A and any and all cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan is completed; and
4. Chapters shall be responsible for the repairs and maintenance and insurance costs for their respective Heavy Equipment.
5. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered within ninety (90) days of distribution to the Division of Community Development, unless recommended otherwise by the Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee.

SECTION FIVE. ALLOCATION OF ~~433,876,114~~ TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES AND ADOPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates ~~thirty-three-million-eight hundred-seventy-six thousand one hundred fourteen dollars~~ (~~433,876,114~~) from the Síhasin Fund to the Department of Water Resources to implement the Síhasin Fund Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as detailed in Exhibit B.


SECTION FOURTEEN. DIRECTIVES



AN ACT RELATING TO THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES; AMENDING CJA-01-21 AND NABIS-36-21 TO EXTEND THE DEADLINES FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF SÍHASIN FUNDS FOR CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT PURCHASES AND FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council empowered to exercise oversight over matters involving water, land, environment, economic and community development, public utilities, and the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, among other responsibilities. 2 N.N.C. § 500(B); 2 N.N.C. § 500(C) (1).
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to hear proposed resolutions requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) (9); 2 N.N.C. § 700(A); 2 N.N.C. § 701(A) (3).
- C. In Resolution No. CJA-01-21 the Navajo Nation Council allocated money from the Síhasin Fund to the Division of Community Development for heavy equipment purchases for the 110 Chapters, and to the Division of Natural Resources/Department of Water Resources for the Department's Emergency Projects. Also, in CJA-01-21, the Council delegated to the Resources Committee and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee the authority over the deadline for the expenditure of the allocated Síhasin funds. Resolution No. CJA-01-21 is incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. As stated above, CJA-01-21 allocated money from the Síhasin Fund for the Division of Community Development to purchase of certain heavy equipment for the 110 Chapters, and for the Department of Water Management to purchase needed equipment and pay for waterline projects and other projects listed in Exhibit B of CJA-01-21 ("DWR Emergency Projects"). Although CJA-01-21 was line-item vetoed by President Nez, the veto did not affect the allocated funds for the heavy equipment

purchases, and it affected only a portion of the funds for the DWR Emergency Projects.

- B. CJA-01-21 established a deadline for the use of the approved Síhasin funds for the heavy equipment purchases and the DWR Emergency Projects. These original deadlines have been extended, most recently by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee in Resolution No. NABIS-36-21. Currently, the deadline for the heavy equipment purchases is December 30, 2021 and the deadline for the DWR Emergency Projects is March 31, 2022. NABIS-36-21 is incorporated herein by this reference.
- C. At this time, both the Division of Community Development and the Department of Water Resources need more time to complete all purchases of heavy equipment for the 110 Chapters, and to fully expend the Síhasin funds for the DWR Emergency Projects.
- D. Because of the Chapters' need for the heavy equipment, and the dire need for the DWR Emergency Projects that will provide clean running water in many Navajo Nation communities, the Navajo Nation finds it to be in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People to extend the deadlines set forth in NABIS-36-21 for the expenditure of the Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF DEADLINES

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an extension of the deadline for the expenditure of the Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 for the DWR Emergency Projects, from March 31, 2022 to the new deadline of December 31, 2023.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an extension of the deadline for the expenditure of the Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 for the 110 Chapters' heavy equipment purchases from December 30, 2022 to the new deadline of December 31, 2023.
- C. Any Síhasin funds approved in CJA-01-21 that are not spent or encumbered in accordance with the approved Expenditure Plans by the new deadlines set forth in Section Three (A) and Section Three (B) herein shall revert to the Síhasin Fund, unless otherwise recommended by the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council and otherwise approved by the Naabik'iyáti' Committee.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE


This Act shall become effective in accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 2505 and 2 N.N.C. § 189.

SECTION FIVE. SUPERSEDING AND SAVING CLAUSES

- A. The new deadlines set forth in Section Three (A) and Three (B) of this Act shall supersede inconsistent provisions in any previous resolution of the Navajo Nation Council or a standing committee, to the extent that such previous resolutions establish a deadline for the expenditure of Sihasin funds approved in CJA-01-21.
- B. If any portion of this Act is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a final order of a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

3. Pursuant to Kayenta Chapter Resolution No KY26-11-020, the Kayenta Chapter approved the request for proposal for the Kayenta Senior Center demolition project; and
4. The Kayenta Chapter has followed the Kayenta Chapter’s Five Management System-Procurement Policies in procuring goods exceeding \$50,000.00; and
5. The Kayenta Senior Center demolition project BID No. 25-12-3959SB was advertised for two weeks, and
6. A mandatory site visit took place on Friday, January 16, 2026, with six contractors present; and
7. The RFP was due on Friday, January 30, 2026, with 4 bids received; and
8. The bids received were opened on Friday, February 6, 2026; and
9. The Kayenta Chapter Administration and Chapter Officials, along with other Navajo Nation entities, conducted a comprehensive evaluation of all the bids; and
10. The bid received from “Tiis Yá Toh Inc.” has been determined to be the lowest responsive bidder; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Kayenta Chapter hereby approves the award of a contract to “Tiis Yá Toh Inc.” for the Kayenta Senior Center demolition project for the amount of \$92,723.18.

APPROVING THE COMMUNITY LAND USE PLANNING COMMITTEE (CLUPC) PLAN OF OPERATION FOR THE KAYENTA CHAPTER.

WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. The Kayenta Chapter has established a Community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC) to assist the Chapter in land use planning, community development, and related matters affecting the Kayenta Chapter community; and
4. The community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC) developed a Plan of Operation to outline its purpose, roles, responsibilities, procedures, and governance structure; and
5. The CLUPC Plan of Operation was reviewed, voted upon, and approved by the duly appointed CLUPC committee members at a properly noticed meeting; and
6. The approved CLUPC Plan of Operation has been presented to the Kayenta Chapter membership for review and consideration; and
7. Approval of the CLUPC Plan of Operation by the Kayenta Chapter membership is necessary to formally adopt and implement the Plan of Operation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Kayenta Chapter hereby approves and adopts the Community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC) Plan of Operation, as reviewed and approved by the CLUPC committee members and presented to the Kayenta Chapter membership
2. The approved CLUPC Plan of Operation shall take effect immediately upon adoption by the Kayenta Chapter and shall guide the operations and functions of the Community Land Use Planning Committee. Attached as Exhibit A is the CLUPC Plan of Operation.

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

I. ESTABLISHMENT

- A. In accordance with the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C. § 2004, the Kayenta Chapter Community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC) is hereby established by Chapter Resolution # _____, at a duly called regular Chapter meeting on at which a valid quorum was present.
- B. The CLUPC will also be known as the Kayenta Chapter Land Use Planning Committee.
- C. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice (NNDOJ) created this Plan template and if unaltered, the CLUPC may begin using it upon approval of the Chapter membership.
- D. Hereinafter, the Kayenta Chapter will be referred to as “Chapter.”

II. PURPOSE

- A. The CLUPC is a standing committee of the Chapter and is an advisory committee of the Chapter.
- B. This Plan serves as the main guide for activities related to the operation of the CLUPC.
- C. The original primary purpose of the CLUPC is to prepare and finalize a Community-Based Land Use Plan (CLUP) that meets the needs of the community. After the public hearings, the CLUP shall be submitted for community approval at a duly called Regular Chapter Meeting. Thereafter, the CLUP will be presented to the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council for approval.
- D. After certification of the CLUP, the CLUPC of a Governance Certified Chapter shall review all zoning ordinances to ensure compliance with the CLUP.

III. COMMITTEE AUTHORITY

- A. The CLUPC shall exercise the applicable duties and responsibilities outlined in the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C. § 2004.
- B. The CLUPC will develop and oversee the implementation of a Comprehensive Plan, managed in 5-year increments, for the Chapter by making decisions and recommendations about its planning and administrative process and land use development.
- C. The CLUPC may recommend the selection of a Planner to assist in the development and update of the CLUP. The contracting of a Planner shall be done in compliance with the Chapter Five Management System and subject to Chapter fund availability.
- D. The CLUPC may coordinate with various entities, including Universities and Colleges, to assist in data collection, analysis, and implementation of the planning process.
- E. The people of the Chapter, in a duly called meeting, will have the authority to review all development-related matters recommended by the CLUPC which may require further review by the Navajo Nation.
- F. CLUPC will not formulate budgets or monitor chapter assets, projects and programs.

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

- G. CLUPC members may provide recommendations to the Chapter and will not overstep the boundaries of the Chapter Administration. See 26 N.N.C. § 1004 et seq.
- H. CLUPC does not have the power to grant grazing privileges to community members. However, CLUPC can communicate with the appropriate grazing permit granting authority to ensure permits are granted in keeping with the community's larger plan for land use.
- I. The CLUPC has no implied authority to enforce other Navajo Nation laws and policies such as the Resource Grazing and Livestock Management Regulations.
- J. CLUPC has no implied authority to assist the Land Board with mediation of any land disputes.
- K. All resolutions approved by the CLUPC shall be set forth in writing and certified; copies of certified resolutions shall be provided to the Chapter Administration.

IV. MEMBERSHIP

- A. CLUPC shall consist of five (5) members.
- B. CLUPC Members shall serve a four (4) year term that runs concurrently with Chapter officials.
- C. Selections:
 - 1. Generally:
 - a. Interested Individuals shall submit their letter of interest to the Chapter President.
 - b. Upon a favorable review, the Chapter President appoints all CLUPC Members; and
 - c. The Chapter President's selection shall be approved by the community at a duly called Regular Chapter Meeting. See 26 N.N.C. § 2004 (C)(1).
 - 2. Alternative Selection Procedure:
 - a. Interested Individuals shall submit their letter of interest to the CLUPC.
 - b. Upon a favorable review, the CLUPC shall submit their nominee(s) to the Chapter.
 - c. The nominee(s) shall be approved by the community at a duly called Regular Chapter Meeting.
- D. Chapter Officials are eligible to serve as CLUPC Members but will need to avoid any conflicts of interest.

V. QUALIFICATIONS

- A. Must be at least 18 years of age.
- B. Registered member of the Chapter.
- C. Have experience, expertise, or knowledge of land use planning and development principles.

VI. CLUPC OFFICERS

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

A. CHAIRPERSON

1. The CLUPC Membership shall select all CLUPC Officers.
2. The Chairperson shall preside over all CLUPC meetings. The Chairperson shall call special meetings of the CLUPC with prior notice to the membership, when necessary.
3. The Chairperson maintains order at all CLUPC meetings and has the authority to suspend or adjourn a CLUPC meeting in the event of:
 - a) Disorderly conduct
 - b) Lack of decorum including, but not limited to, rudeness
 - c) Unforeseen emergency
4. The Chairperson provides all representatives of the community with an equal opportunity to speak on concerns before the CLUPC.
5. The Chairperson shall work closely with the Chapter officials, Chapter Administration staff, and other concerned groups or agencies.
6. The Chairperson encourages and promotes community participation in planning and development.
7. The Chairperson shall advance the interest of the community in all matters.

B. VICE-CHAIRPERSON

1. Presides and performs the duties of the Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson and shall perform all other duties that may be assigned by the Chairperson.
2. Assist with preparing the CLUPC meeting agendas.
3. Assist with meeting minutes in the absence of the Secretary.

C. SECRETARY

1. Electronically record and write CLUPC meeting minutes and keep record of all adopted resolutions, records, and minutes of each meeting.
2. Assist the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson in preparing the agenda for CLUPC meetings and ensuring the agenda is posted at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the start of the meeting.
3. Submit all CLUPC records to the Chapter Administration within ten (10) working days.
4. Secretary shall return all CLUPC records and property upon the end of the tenure from office.

VII. MEETING AND QUORUM

- A. CLUPC members may conduct one (1) meeting per month, on the _____ of each month. All CLUPC meetings shall be open to the community. However, any portion of the meeting may need to go into Executive Session upon approval majority vote of the CLUPC.

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

- B. All CLUPC actions shall be recorded through a certified resolutions or written memorandum setting forth the action taken and filed with the CLUPC Secretary and Chapter Administration.
- C. Each meeting will be held in person and each CLUPC official is required to appear in person for each duly called meeting. However, if the Chapter has authorized virtual-hybrid meetings, the Chapter may also extend virtual-hybrid meetings for the CLUPC. The CLUPC may need to contact the Department of Justice for further guidance.
- D. A quorum is established when three (3) CLUPC members are present at a duly called meeting.
 - 1. Special Meetings may be called by the Chairperson.
 - 2. Special Emergency meetings and Work sessions also require adherence to the forty-eight (48) hour notice requirement.

VIII. REMOVAL, RESIGNATION OR VACANCIES

- A. Removal
 - 1. There is no entitlement to the membership of the CLUPC. Any CLUPC member(s) may be removed for any reason such as failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings.
 - 2. Removal of a CLUPC member before the term ending date requires minimal due process. The following steps should be followed when removing a CLUPC member with due process:
 - a) The Chairperson shall provide notice to the affected member by providing written notice that the member is being recommended for removal. If the Chairperson is being recommended for removal, the Chapter President shall issue notice to the CLUPC Chairperson. The Notice shall inform the member that he/she will have an opportunity to speak at the upcoming Regular Chapter Meeting to explain why he/she should not be removed.
 - b) At the Regular Chapter Meeting, the member will have an opportunity to be heard. Thereafter, the Chapter membership will vote in favor or opposed to the removal.
 - c) The decision by the community is final. Also, separate or individual removal resolutions are required for each member being recommended for removal.
- B. Resignation
 - 1. A CLUPC member may resign at any time.
 - 2. The CLUPC member shall provide their resignation in writing.
 - 3. Failure to provide a resignation in writing will trigger the removal process in subsection (A) herein.

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

- C. Abandonment. When a majority of the CLUPC abandons their position resulting in the inability of the CLUPC to operate and/or the CLUPC has not operated for a significant amount of time, the Chapter President shall inform the community at a Regular Chapter Meeting of the need to replace the CLUPC membership using the appointment procedure in Section IV.
 - D. Vacancies. When a member is removed or resigns, a registered community member within the Chapter can be appointed or nominated in accordance with Section IV.
- IX. RULES
- A. The CLUPC shall conduct its meetings according to applicable portions of the Parliamentary Rules of Order.
 - B. Meetings shall be conducted with *K'e* principles.
- X. COMPENSATION
- A. Eligible CLUPC members shall be compensated upon submittal of a claim form to the Chapter Administration.
 - B. Committee members may receive a stipend of \$125.00 for each monthly meeting in accordance with the approved Chapter budget. Additional meetings may be compensated depending on the availability of funds and any necessary budget modifications.
 - C. Reports shall be furnished for all CLUPC meetings, regular or special, on CLUPC member's attendance to ensure proper compensation for said meetings.
 - D. Chapter shall pay stipends for CLUPC members selected in accordance with Section IV. There shall be no compensation for *pro tempore* members.
 - E. CLUPC members are not entitled to travel reimbursement. However, when properly approved, CLUPC members may receive allowable travel expenditure reimbursements per the Chapter's approved budget for the attendant fiscal year, and in accordance with all applicable Navajo Nation laws and regulations including the Navajo Nation Employee Travel Policies and Procedures Handbook.
 - F. A Chapter Employee serving as a CLUPC member shall be on authorized leave prior to performing CLUPC duties. This includes attendance of CLUPC meetings. Accordingly, such employees may earn a stipend in accordance with the rules herein.
- XI. ETHICS
- A. Appointment. The Navajo Nation Ethics in Government Law 2 N.N.C. Sections 3751-3761 to Section 3751(A), requires accountability to the people of the Navajo Nation by their elected, appointed, and assigned public officials and employees in exercising the authority rested or to be rested with them as a matter of public trust.

KAYENTA CLUPC Plan of Operation

- B. **Conflict of Interest.** Generally, there is no inherent conflict of interest for a Chapter Official or Chapter Employee to serve on the CLUPC. However, there is always a potential for a conflict of interest to arise requiring the CLUPC member to recuse (disqualify) themselves from the particular action being considered by the CLUPC. A CLUPC member serving in both capacities has the duty and responsibility to know about conflicts of interests.

XII. LOCATION

The principal location of CLUPC meetings shall be at the Chapter house.

XIII. CHAPTER OVERSIGHT

The CLUPC committee shall operate under the oversight of the Chapter.

XIV. DEFINITIONS

- A. Conflict of interest – means the reasonable foreseeability that any personal or economic interest of a public official, or employee, will be affected in any materially different manner from the interest of the general public, but any decision, enactment, agreement, award or other official action or function of any governmental body or political obligation of the Navajo Nation. See 2 N.N.C. § 3743(G).
- B. Reaffirmation resolution – means every year, at the beginning of each fiscal year the committee membership will be reaffirmed by the Chapter membership through a Chapter resolution.

XV. AMENDMENTS

This CLUPC Plan of Operation can be amended at the recommendation of the Chapter Administration, Chapter Officials, and CLUPC Committee members. All amendments proposing new language will be underlined and any amendments being deleted will be overstricken. The draft containing the underlines and strikeouts will be presented by the CLUPC at a Planning meeting. The CLUPC will thereafter present the amendments at a Regular Chapter meeting. The Chapter shall approve or disapprove the amendments at a regularly duly called chapter meeting.
