- Stanley Clitso commented on Resolutions **KY26-07-69** and **KY26-07-70**, explaining that the proposed budget transfers are being made within the same account and are simply being moved to different line-item categories. He reassured the community that the funds are **not** being transferred to another account or mismanaged. Mr. Clitso further explained that the funds are restricted for their intended purposes and noted that the budget transfer forms have been attached to each resolution to provide transparency and allow the community to review the proposed changes.

5. **Resolution No. KY26-07-072**
RESPECTFULLY SUPPORTING THE FORMAL LAND WITHDRAWAL OF TEN (10) ACRES, FOR THE USE AND DEVELOPMENT BY THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF TRANSPORTATION (NDOT) FOR A MAINTENANCE YARD ON THE NAVAJO NATION TRIBAL TRUST LANDS LOCATED IN THE KAYENTA CHAPTER SERVICE BOUNDARY.

- **Malik Scott** – Introduced himself and provided background information to the meeting attendees. He explained that NDOT contacted the Kayenta Chapter to request land for a maintenance yard to serve the Western Agency. Currently, there are no NDOT maintenance yards in the Western Agency, and NDOT plans to establish seven maintenance yards throughout the Navajo Nation. The

proposed yard would help reduce rising fuel costs, improve response times, and allow equipment to be mobilized more efficiently. He stated that the purpose of the meeting was for the community to determine which tract they preferred. He explained that the project is still in its early stages, with the first step being approval of a Chapter Resolution, followed by a legal survey, grazing consent, environmental and wildlife compliance, and archaeological compliance.

- **Howard Martinez** – Introduced himself to the community.
- **Community Member** – Requested that NDOT explain the advantages and disadvantages of both proposed sites so the community could make an informed decision.
- **Malik Scott** – Explained that factors being considered include road access, existing township road access at one of the sites, soil and clay conditions, floodplain concerns, and coordination with grazing permit holders and any nearby homeowners.
- **Stanley Clitso** – Stated his support for the proposed **Tract B** location.
- **Albert Bailey** – Asked about the Kayenta Township Commission (KTC) boundary and the Kayenta Chapter service area in relation to the proposed sites.
- **Martha Young** – Expressed concerns regarding the proximity of the proposed maintenance yard to the Kayenta Health Center and its helipad. She asked about the differences between ADOT and NDOT and what responsibilities NDOT has within the Western Agency. She also questioned whether heavy equipment operations would interfere with hospital or helipad activities.
- **Malik Scott** – Explained that **ADOT (Arizona Department of Transportation)** has jurisdiction over state and federal highways, while **NDOT (Navajo Division of Transportation)** is responsible for Navajo Nation and BIA road systems. NDOT does not maintain state or federal highways unless there is a formal partnership agreement.
- **Stanley Clitso** – Added that ADOT serves the State of Arizona, while NDOT serves the Navajo Nation. He explained that the purpose of the maintenance yard is to establish a permanent facility in Kayenta to improve emergency response and project mobilization while reducing transportation costs. He noted that NDOT currently utilizes space at Kayenta Unified School District but needs a larger, permanent maintenance facility.
- **Lorraine Sullivan** – Stated that after reviewing both proposed sites, she supports **Tract A** due to safety concerns involving the hospital and helipad. She also expressed support for the land withdrawal for Tract A and commented that the road between Kayenta and Chilchinbeto is in poor condition and would benefit from improved maintenance.
- **Letresia Todecheene** – Asked what level of maintenance and response the community could expect from NDOT's heavy equipment operations, particularly regarding road maintenance and repairs.

- **Malik Scott** – Explained that NDOT receives significant federal funding and works closely with the BIA on road maintenance projects. He stated that each Chapter has a Regional Road Maintenance Plan. Currently, NDOT is authorized to maintain only public roads that are open 24 hours a day and serve at least three homes. NDOT does not have funding or authorization to maintain private roads except during emergency situations, when they may coordinate with Chapters to provide assistance.
- **Stanley Clitso** – Added that NDOT has coordinated with local school districts to prioritize maintenance of school bus routes and other heavily traveled roadways within the region.
- **Mirriam Todecheene** – Expressed her support for NDOT continuing to maintain school bus routes.

Brittany Hunt introduced herself and gave a summarization of her past work history and community involvement with non-profit organizations. She mentioned she was to become a peacemaker, to go through the training and eventually become a probation officer is her ultimate goal. I was informed the process would take over a year to get my application process, but I was told if I get a chapter resolution support I could get in a lot faster. She requests her support from the community.

Community member-raised concerns about homesite leases, electrical hook up issues. I do not support this resolution, due to my concerns of hookups.

Martha Young- what has peacemaker have to do with what she went through. Also, if there a dispute issue, shouldn't we wait? Shouldn't we wait till that has been cleared?

Dalton Singer- commented that the sponsor Ms. Hunt is no longer a elected grazing official, so all issues and concerns that is regarding to land or grazing are not apart of this supporting resolution. This supporting resolution is just requesting from Ms. Hunt to assist her in moving her application forward to become a Navajo Nation peacemaker.

1. Carmenlita Apodaca- what measures were taken since the loss of my grandson, I've asked our leaders, to this date, we have not gotten an answer for what is going to be done. What are the safety protocols being put into place for the elder day coming up.

2. Mrs. Chief- I thank you for the updates that you have given to the chapter members here today, can we get updates using some other form so we can help.

3. Dalton Singer- spoke on ensuring the chapter is doing its best to get the public safety department part of the event for elder day, but as Navajos we tend to disregard signs and safety markers. We as community members need to do our best to report people who are under the influence, we need to protect our community. Also, when there are public hearings, we need to attend the meetings, to address these concerns. I've been to two public hearings and there were no community members there, just officials. We need our community members there to address issues and concerns, that really helps us when we work with delegates, divisions and branches.

Delegate Shaandiin Parrish Report

Delegate Shaandiin Parrish asks to be excused from the July 13, 2026, Kayenta Chapter meeting as she is presiding over 2027 Fiscal Year Comprehensive Budget Hearings in Window Rock, Arizona at the Budget and Finance Committee Meeting this evening. She thanks everyone for attending the 2027 Fiscal Year Navajo Nation Budget Public Hearing in Oljato, Utah on June 30, 2026, and will apply your resolutions and comments to this year's Navajo Nation budget.

Delegate Shaandiin Parrish also wanted to share she was in the hospital from June 2 to June 19, 2026, and has continued to recovery from two surgeries at home from June 22 to July 4, 2026. Delegate Parrish's doctor has issued her a notice to recover from home for 6-weeks after her second surgery. Her doctor's initial issuance ends on July 24, 2026, but still makes an effort to be in the community and attend meetings.

Delegate Parrish will be hosting a Meet & Greet on Saturday, July 18, 2026, at 10:00 A.M. in Chilchinbeto, Arizona, if you need to meet with her in person.

While Delegate Parrish is at home recovering, she appreciates your prayers, patience, and grace. She has the following updates:

Good evening. Thank you, Kayenta Chapter Leadership, for reading and sharing my written report.

1. Navajo County has enacted the Fire Restrictions Stage 1, on May 14, 2026.
 - A. The restrictions are in place due to increased fire danger caused by hot, dry, and windy conditions, and the long drought.
 - B. Stage 1 restrictions prohibit:
 - a. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove, including in developed campgrounds or improved sites
 - b. Smoking (including e-cigarettes) in the park and on trails, with exceptions for enclosed vehicles/campers
 - c. Dragging chains and any kind of metal
 - C. All the 3 Northern Arizona Counties are on Stage 2 Fire Restriction which will include all of the above and,
 - a. Building of any fires, smoking outside, blasting, welding, operating a generator and chainsaw powered by internal combustion engines are all prohibited.
 - b. Operating motorized vehicles off designated roads and trails
 - c. Use of explosive targets, tracer rounds, or incendiary ammunition.
 - D. Weather: It is noted that we will be entering into Super "El Nino" weather pattern. It is predicted that the weather will be extreme from being too hot to heavy rains (when the monsoon arrives).
 - a. Please be prepared, have water and snacks with you when you travel. Also, have an emergency kit, as well as a charged cell phone, a flashlight with good batteries and a shovel, among other safety items.
 - b. Do not cross running water especially in these washes out here. 10 inches of waterflow can pull a vehicle with it and 6 inches can knock a person over; but who's going to be measuring. Just practice safety.
 - c. Chapters can request sandbags from the County.
 - E. Navajo Nation has declared Drought Emergency signed by the NN President on June 10, 2026, due to stress on water supplies, rangelands, reservoirs and local economies. Stage 2 Fire restrictions were also declared on all Navajo Nation.
 - F. All Navajo County funds for HURF (highway user revenue fund) and District Funds from July 1, 2026:
 - a. Chapters can apply for district funds now; And chapters can submit proposals for small road projects.
 - b. The Comprehensive Budget for the Navajo County was approved at the latest Board of Supervisors' meeting on June 23, 2026.
 - c. Budget cuts happened without compromising county employment.

- G. Navajo County had offered to purchase supplies for Parrish Crossing, however, because of the delay and Kayenta Chapter's decision to apply through NACOG. The County's task changed to writing a support letter for the NACOG Grant. Navajo County will monitor the granting status.
- H. After meeting with ADOT, it was decided that the Kayenta chapter will seek funds for road project on US Hwy 163 beginning at US Hwy 160 to Monument Valley High School/Kayenta Boarding School. I needs to cover new crosswalk/pedestrian markings and signs
- I. Encourage your teenager and everyone over 18 years of age to register to vote.
 - a. Voter's registration information is available in the chapter administration offices, at Township Office, Post Offices, , Navajo County Office at entrance to Kayenta Rural Alternative Hospital, on-line, and the County Recorder's office.
 - b. Voter's Registration will reopen abut a week after Navajo County/ AZ State & Federal elections.
 - c. July 21, 2026, is the PRIMARY Election Day for both Arizona State, all Counties, and Navajo Nation.
- J. GENERAL ELECTION: November 3, 2026, For all County, State and Federal elected offices.
