WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. The Rural Climate Partnership grant program is designed to provide critical funding and resources to grantees that are taking practical, community-focused and innovative actions to implement equitable climate solutions in rural America; and
4. The Rural Climate Partnership aims to strengthen rural economies, advance locally led climate solutions, deliver equitable benefits from climate investments, and transform climate narratives; and
5. The Rural Climate Partnership focuses on the following core investment areas in its grantmaking, capacity building, and narrative infrastructure:
 - a. Clean Energy
 - b. Regenerative Agriculture
 - c. Electrification and Efficiency

6. The Kayenta Chapter Wood bank provides dependable firewood and heating fuel to vulnerable families, particularly elders, disabled residents, Veterans, and low-income households; and

APPROVING THE KAYENTA CHAPTER PROPERTY DISPOSITION AND SALE OF PROPERTY.

WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. Pursuant to the Kayenta Chapter resolution No. KT-06-112-10, the Kayenta Chapter approved the 2010 Edition Five Management System (FMS) for use by Kayenta Chapter in the lawful management of the Chapter as directed by the Navajo Department of Justice and Office of Auditor General; and
4. Pursuant to the Kayenta Chapter Five Management System, Property Management Policies and Procedures, the Kayenta Chapter shall properly dispose of its property and equipment that will involve not only the physical disposition, but also the reconciliation of the accounting records to reflect such disposal; and
5. The Kayenta Chapter Manager, in consultation with the Kayenta Chapter Officials, shall approve any disposal of Kayenta Chapter property and/or equipment; and
6. All disposal of Kayenta Chapter property shall be reported to the Kayenta Chapter membership via public notice or at Kayenta Chapter meeting by the Kayenta Chapter Manager; and
7. If the Kayenta Chapter identifies surplus property, the Kayenta Chapter Manager shall inform the Kayenta Chapter membership that such property exists so that the Kayenta Chapter membership may have first opportunity to purchase such surplus property; and
8. When a sale of Kayenta Chapter property is to be made, the Kayenta Chapter Administration shall post a notice of sale in conspicuous places for thirty (30) days before said sale; and
9. The Kayenta Chapter Manager shall be responsible for assuring that all documents verifying the sale are provided so that proceeds of such a sale will be credited to Other Revenues in the fund that generated the original purchase; and
10. If information to Other Revenues is not available, the proceeds will be credited to Other Revenues in the General Fund.

The Kayenta Chapter hereby approves the Chapter property disposition and sale of property; herein attached as Exhibit "A".

REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL AND THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE TO AMEND THE UNIFORM BUSINESS LEASING REGULATIONS OF 2008.

WHEREAS,

1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3(A), the Kayenta Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Section 10; and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1(B), the Kayenta Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction(s) when necessary and make recommendation(s) to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate action(s); and
3. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C., § 724 (B) (2) authorizes the Economic Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council to delegate its approval or granting authority to the Division of Economic Development, Navajo Nation Shopping Centers, Inc., an Entity, Chapters, or Townships; and
4. Pursuant to the Uniform Business Leasing Regulations of 2008, § 801 (1.2), the Business Office shall consist of a computer, printer, and other necessary office supplies. The Staff shall consist of at least one individual with an education primarily in a business-related field. The Staff shall not consist of a public official and shall operate separate from any political influence; and
5. The requirement for a separate office for the Business Office should be stricken, as it is no longer practical or feasible for all certified chapters; and
6. Mandatory infrastructure requiring a dedicated Business Office forces certified chapters to secure a physical space, even when they lack buildings or available facilities; and
7. Renovating or constructing a building is a major capital expense; and
8. Many Chapters operate on limited budgets and cannot absorb these costs without diverting funds from essential services; and
9. Maintaining a separate office adds recurring expenses like utilities, maintenance, and insurance; and
10. Chapters with fewer resources are disproportionately burdened by these requirements.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Kayenta Chapter hereby requests the Navajo Nation Council and the Resources and Development Committee to amend the Uniform Business Leasing Regulations of 2008 to strike the requirement for a separate business office building.
